

1. There are 18 holes and you play with other people. You have a maximum of 14 clubs - some to hit the ball a long way and one to put the ball in the hole from a short distance. Sport:
2. You play in white against another team of 11 people, also in white. One player throws a hard red ball and tries to hit three pieces of wood (the wicket), while the player from the other team tries to protect the wicket. If possible, he or she tries to hit the ball quite far and then starts running so he or she can score points. Sport:
3. There are two teams of six players and there is a high net between them. The idea is for a player to push the ball into the air and for another to try and smash the ball onto the floor on the other side, while the other side tries to stop it from hitting the floor. Sport:
4. It's a game played by two players, traditionally dressed in white, who hit a small yellow ball back and forward with a racket, trying to avoid a net in the middle and to get the ball to land inside the white perimeter lines. Sport:
